

Are you prepared for BRE IT? - EU settlement scheme

What is the EU Settlement Scheme?

- Work in the UK
- 🕀 Use the NHS
- Enrol in education or continue studying
- Access public funds such as benefits and pensions, if you're eligible for them
 - Travel in and out of the UK

Who is eligible?



What about family members of eligible EU citizens?

If you are granted settled or pre-settled status, your close family members can join you in the UK before **31 December 2020** if:

- Your relationship began with them before 31 December 2020; and
- You are still in the relationship when they apply to join you.

What's the difference between settled and pre-settled status?

Settled status: You may be eligible if you've been living in the UK for more than 5 continuous years as at **31 December 2020**. With settled status, there is no time limit on how long you can stay in the UK.

Pre-settled status: You may be eligible if you've been living in the UK for less than 5 years as at **31 December 2020**. With pre-settled status, you are able to stay in the UK for 5 years.

When can I apply?

You can apply until **30 June 2021** if the UK leaves the EU with a deal. However, if the UK leaves the EU without a deal then the deadline for applications is **31 December 2020**.

How much does it cost to apply?

It is completely **free** to apply for settled status.

How do I apply?

To apply for settled or pre-settled status, you will need to complete a short online application form. You will need to:

- Verify your identity and nationality by scanning passport, national identity card or biometric residence card and uploading a photograph of yourself.
- Confirm your residence provide your NI number or other documentation.
- Complete the Criminality check by declaring any criminal convictions.
